

(234) This Indenture made the two & Twentieth day of August in the year of Our Lord God One Thousand Seven Hundred Twenty & Seven Between Charles Diggs of Prince Georges County Gent. of One part & Charles Calvert of Ann Arundell County Esq. of Other parts Whereas Nathl. Rorer late of Prince Georges County Esq. made publick proposals of and sett up a Lottery commonly called Rorer's Two Thousand pound Lottery The Prizes whereof consisting amongst other things of Sundry Tracts or parcels of Land And whereas to avoid any Obstruction to Drawing off sd Lottery by sd Nathl's Death and that y^e Adventurers therein might on such Accident have y^e full benefit of such prizes as they should be Intitled to by sd Lottery y^e sd Nathl. did by a Codicill duely Executed & annexed to his Last will and Testament bearing date on or about y^e sixth day of April One Thousand Seven hundred Twenty & Seven authorize & Request Col^o Thom^o Addison & Charles Diggs as or either of them to convey & make Over any y^e Lands Mentioned in y^e sd Lottery unto such y^e Adventurers as should be Intitled thereto as in and by y^e Codicill aforesaid more fully appears And whereas y^e Charles Calvert is Intitled to y^e Prize in y^e Scheme of y^e sd Lottery Numbered Seven consisting of One hundred Acres of Land part of a Tract of Land called Elizabeths Delight lying in Prince Georges County at y^e head of y^e Eastern Branch of Potomack River Originally Granted unto Col^o William Diggs y^e Ninth day of March One thousand Six hundred & Eighty & Eight for one Thousand Acres as in and by y^e Grant thereof relation being thereunto had it doth and may more fully and at large appear w^{ch} One hundred Acres is distinguished in a plat of y^e sd One Thousand Acres Divided into Eight Lots, by y^e Letter A, Beginning at y^e end of y^e East and by South line of a Lot distinguished in y^e Scheme of y^e sd Lottery by Number
