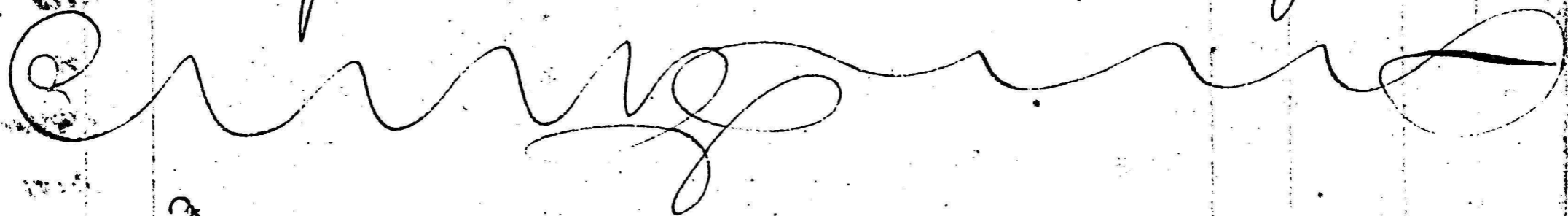

This Indenture made the Seventh day of Nov<sup>r</sup> Anno Dom<sup>o</sup> one thousand  
Seven hundred & twenty three Between Francis Holland Gent of the  
one part and John Crockett March<sup>t</sup> of the other part  
Witneseth that Whereas the S<sup>d</sup> John at the Speciall request  
& request of the S<sup>d</sup> Francis became bound w<sup>th</sup> the S<sup>d</sup> Francis in  
the penalty of two hundred thousand pounds of Tobacco upon  
Condition of the Said Francis should duely Execute the Sherriff  
office of Baltimore County according to Law and that said John  
is desirous of being countersecured and Whereas the S<sup>d</sup> Francis  
has the Reversion in a Tract of Land lying Mostly in annarund  
County called Broughtons ashly, Now these presents Witneseth that  
the S<sup>d</sup> Francis in consideration of the sumes of the sumes  
of five shillings Ster<sup>r</sup>: to him in hand paid & receipt wher  
of the S<sup>d</sup> Francis doth hereby acknowledge hath Bargained and  
sold and by these presents doth bargain & sell unto the S<sup>d</sup> John Cro  
ckett the S<sup>d</sup> Tract of Land w<sup>th</sup> the appurtenances thereunto  
belonging after the decease of William Holland Esqr the  
present possessor and Tenant by Courtesey of the Same So
