


Said Branch Bounding on the same to the first Boundary or Beginning

 ever freely & Quietly without any manner of Challenge Claim or Dem-
 and of me the said John Cornwell or of any other person whatsoever for
 me in my name or by my Cause means or procurement And without any
 Money or other thing thereof to be yielded paid or done unto me the
 said John Cornwell My heirs and assigns and the said John Cornwell
 all and singular the aforesaid Land and premises to the said John Cornwell
 Junr. his heirs and assigns to the use aforesaid against me my heirs and
 assigns or any other person from by or under me Or by any means or pro-
 curement Do warrant and for ever defend by these presents and further
 knowe that the said John Cornwell have given the said John Cornwell
 Junr. peaceable and Quiet possession of free & singular the aforesaid
 Land and premises by the Delivering unto him at y^e Executing hereof
 One Copper piece of Silver Commonly called Six pence Dined in the Seal
 of these presents provided never the less that it is the true Intent &
 meaning of this Deed that Joshua Cornwell Father of the aforesaid John
 Cornwell Junr. shall use Occupy and Quietly Enjoy the aforesaid Land
 and premises During his natural life without any let hindrance
 or molestation of the said John Cornwell Junr. or any other person
 anything in this Deed to the contrary notwithstanding In witness
 whereof I hereunto set my hand and Seal this second day of
 November Anno Domini 1728.
