

This Indenture made the first day of September in the  
 year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and Thirty Between  
 Thomas Jones of Baltimore County in the province of Maryland  
 of the one part and Nathaniel Chew and Ann Chew residuary legatees of  
 Nathaniel Chew late of Ann Arundell County in the Same  
 province deceased of the other part Witnesseth That the Said  
 Thomas Jones in for and in consideration of the Sum of Fifteen  
 Pounds Sterling to him the said Thomas Jones in hand paid by the  
 Said Nathaniel Chew deceased The Receipt whereof the Said  
 Thomas Jones doth hereby confess and acknowledge and thereof  
 and every part thereof doth acquit exonerate and discharge as  
 well the said Nathaniel Chew his heirs & Assigns as the said  
 Nathaniel Joseph and Ann party to this Deed  
 their heirs & Assigns and every of them by these  
 presents Doth give Grant Bargain Sell a line enfeoff, release &  
 confirm unto the said Nathaniel Chew Joseph Chew and Ann Chew  
 All these two pieces or parcels of Land lying and being on Herring  
 Creek being parts or parcels of one whole Tract called and  
 known by the name of Pascals Purchase The one being  
 Surveyed and laid out for a certain Jonathan Jones under whom the said  
 Thomas Claim<sup>s</sup> the fifteenth day of Feb<sup>r</sup> Seventeen hundred by  
 a certain Richard Beard and Beginning at a bounded white Oak being  
 a bounded Tree of John Wilsons being a bounded Tree of another parcel of  
 Land sold out of the said Tract & running from the said white Oak East  
 South East Twenty two perches to a bounded Hickory Then South  
 One degree West One hundred forty eight perches to a bounded  
 poplar Then West half a point North to the Land of the said John  
 Wilson Then by the several Courses of the said Wilsons Land  
 To the first bounded white Oak containing and laid out for forty  
 Acres of Land The other part being like wise Surveyed and laid  
 out for the said Jonathan Jones by Thomas for his some  
 time Survey for Ann Arundell County on the Ninth day of  
 June in the year of our Lord Seventeen hundred and four  
 Beginning at a bounded York Hickory Standing at the end of an East  
 South East
