 Honourable Charles Absolute Lord and Proprietary of the  
 Province of Maryland &c Anno Domini seventeenth (Hunda-  
 red and Thirty) BETWEEN Joseph Willson of Province  
 Georges County in the Province of Maryland Gentleman  
 of the One part and Daniel Carroll of Malborough in  
 the said County and Province Merchant of the Other  
 part Witness Eth that the said Joseph Willson for and  
 in Consideration of the sume of Seventy pounds Current  
 Money of Maryland &c foreaid to him in hand paid at or  
 before the Ensealing and Delivery of these Presents the  
 receipt whereof the doth hereby Acknowledge & himselfe  
 therewith fully Satisfied and Contented and thereof and  
 of every part and parcell thereof doth fully Clearely and  
 absolutely Acquitt and Discharge him the said Daniel Carroll  
 his heirs Executors Administrators and Assignes for ever  
 Hatt given Granted Bargained sold Aliened Infeoffed and  
 Confirmed AND doth by these Presents absolutely and  
 freely give Grant bargain and sell Alien and Confirm  
 unto him the said Daniell Carroll his Heirs and Assigns  
 for ever all them Two Tracts of Land situate Lying and  
 being in Province Georges County, the One Called Brook hill  
 formerly laid out for Baker Brooks Esq. BEGINNING at a  
 Marked Oak Standing on the North Side of St. Charles  
 Branch being a west Branch of a dividing Creek with a  
 Line drawn North from the said Oak for Length of One hund-  
 red Perches thence West to a Marked Oak from the End of  
 the North Line for Length One hundred and Sixty Perches to a  
 Bounded Oak with a Line drawn South from the End of the West  
 Line for Length One hundred Perches to a marked Oak with a  
 Line drawn East from the End of the South Line for Length of  
 One hundred and Sixty Perches to the first Beginning tree  
 Containing One hundred Acres of Land - The Other Called  
 Kingsale formerly taken up by Jeremiah Sullivan BEGIN-  
 ING at a Bounded white Oak Standing on the North Side  
 of St. Charles Branch near a parcell of Land formerly  
 laid out for Baker Brooke and from the said Oak running  
 North two hundred and four perches to a Bounded Hickory  
 in a Line of a parcell of Land formerly laid out for  
 Thomas Trueman Called Dear Bought Bounded by the said  
 Land and running West and by North for One hundred &  
 Sixty five perches to a Bounded Gum Tree by the Side  
 of a Small Branch in the said Trueman's Line & from  
 (thence).
