


 the provinces of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore
 our Bailiffs and Good people to whom these presents shall come know
 that of our special Grant we have pardoned unto Francis
 Boyd late of Prince Georges County labourer as a proper object of our
 mercy the sum of our fears and whatsoever appertaineth to us
 for that the said Francis Boyd heretofore vizt the first day of May
 in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred & thirty two
 and Anno the Storehouse of certain said Magistrate found in Prince
 Georges County feloniously and burglariously did break & enter and
 five yards of Indian Goods valued shall be of the value of ten Shillings
 but money five yards of Spigged Linen of the value of ten Shillings
 money and five yards and three quarters of a yard of Spanish paper of
 the value of fourteen Shillings money and one pair of Iron woodhosed
 shoes of the value of five Shillings money and four doz and eight
 Indian buttons of the value of two Shillings money & also the
 Goods and Chattels of Mr William Hunt which in London in the
 Storehouse then and there being found there feloniously and
 burglariously did steal take and carry away against our fears
 rule and Govt and act the form of the Act of Assembly in that behalf
 and provided whereof he was convicted before our Justice and well beloved
 John Smith and John Howdall Esqs our Justices of Oyer and Terminer
 and Goal Delivery for our said County of Prince Georges and Grant
 unto him our firm peace and will not that he suffer any corporal
 punishment therefor but that nevertheless he shall stand and be
 in the same flight state and condition as all intent and purpose
 as if the said felony and burglary whereof he the said Francis Boyd
 hath been convicted had never been done or committed **Witness** our
 Justice and well beloved said Sir John Gordon Commander in Chief
 in and over our said province of Maryland this twenty fourth day
 of October in the thirteenth year of our Dominion Anno Dni 1732
