 Agreed by Contract all and every the said parties and the said Sr. Campbell
 Did thereby Covenant Grant and Agree to and with the said John Beale
 his Exor. Adm^r and to and with every of them thereby in Manner & form
 following That the several Goods and Chattles in the Schedule hereunto
 Annexed mentioned and every of them and every part or parcel of them
 Should from time to time and at all times after the Date Death of the said
 Hollin be paid unto had taken received and enjoyed by such person or persons
 to whom the said Hollin Subb should at any time or times during her life Limit
 Give Devise or Appoint or Dispose of the same or any part or parts
 thereof Either by her last Will and Testament in writing or by any writing
 purporting or Intending to be her last Will and Testament or by any other
 Writing to be Signed with her hand or which she should put her Mark to
 in the presence of two or three more credible Witnesses thereunto and it was
 thereby agreed by and between all and every the said parties that for want of
 such Limitation Gift Devise or Appointment or Disposition of her the
 said Hollin as aforesaid that then and in such case that there should be paid
 and disposed out of the several Goods and Chattles in the Schedule thereunto
 Annexed they being Exposed to publick Sale the several Sums of Money
 following That is to say Out of the Money that should be raised out of the
 Sale of the several Goods and Chattles mentioned in the Schedule thereunto
 Annexed To Hollin Mortmore Twenty pound Currant Money to John
 Brigdale at the Age of Twenty four Years Twenty five pound like Money
 to Elizabeth Brigdale Twenty five pound like Money To Mary
 Mortmore fifty pound like Money To Willm^r Mortmore Twenty
 five pound like Money to Thomas Mortmore twenty five pound
 like Money to Hollin Mortmore Daughter of the said Hollin Mortmore
 Twenty pound like Money and Twenty three pound like Money
