On the first day of May Anno Domini 1731 at the request of Mess<sup>rs</sup> John Hyde  
and Com<sup>rs</sup> of London Merchants I John Cotton Notary Publick  
dwelling in London duly admitted & sworn exhibited the Original  
bill of Exchange above Copied to M<sup>r</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Black and of the person  
on whom the name is drawn & Demanding payment of the Contents  
he answered that he would not pay the said bill for want of Effects  
Whereupon I the s<sup>d</sup> Notary at the request aforesaid Protested against  
the drawer of the said bill and all others Concerned for Exchange  
Prochange and all sorts Damages & Interests suffered & to be suffered  
for want of payment of the said Bill of Exchange Thus done & Protested
