one thousand seven hundred and thirty two came before me one of his Lordships  
procl Justices in the province of Maryland the w<sup>th</sup> in named Richard Mofs & acknowledged  
the w<sup>th</sup> in writing to be his act and deed and the said and promised w<sup>th</sup> the  
appurtenances w<sup>th</sup> in mentioned to be the right of the w<sup>th</sup> in named Robert Boons  
his heirs and assigns for ever at the same time likewise came before me  
Jane Mofs the wife of the w<sup>th</sup> in named Richard Mofs and being by me sorely  
Examined out of the hearing of her said husband did freely & voluntarily  
without or threat of her said husband give up all her right title & dower  
claim & demand what soever that she now hath or hereafter may have to  
the within named parcel of Land and promised w<sup>th</sup> the appurtenances and  
acknowledged the s<sup>d</sup> Land & promised w<sup>th</sup> the appurtenances to be the right of the  
within named Robert Boons his heirs & assigns for ever and desired that  
the same might be recorded in the procl Court in testimony whereof I

and thirty two between Charles Farroll of the City of Annapolis  
Esq<sup>r</sup> son and heir at Law one of the heirs of Charles Farroll Esq<sup>r</sup>  
late of the same City deceased and Daniel Farroll of Prince Georges  
County Gent the other son & heir of the s<sup>d</sup> Charles Farroll Esq<sup>r</sup> of  
the one part and John Parran of Calvert County Gent of the other  
part sheweth by an Indenture bearing date the twenty third day  
of March one thousand seven hundred and thirty two between Alexander  
Parran late of Calvert County Gentleman and father of the said  
John Parran of the one part and the s<sup>d</sup> Charles Farroll the father of the  
other part the s<sup>d</sup> Alexander for the consideration therein mentioned  
did amongst other things give bargain sell alien release and confirm  
unto the last mentioned Charles Farroll all the several parts of  
Land following (to wit) a Grant of Land called Parrans Park  
containing three hundred and granted to the s<sup>d</sup> Parran the fourth  
day
