 Aliened Enfeoffed and Confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain
 sell Alien Enfeoff and Confirm unto the said Wm Stephenson his heirs
 and assigns forever all that Tract or parcel of Land called Bright
 Holmston situated lying and being in Kent County containing of Land
 out for one thousand Acres more or less as the same was sold to the said
 Ariana by Henry Evans as also all that Tract or parcel of Land called
 Baldwin Addition lying in Ann Arundell County sold by John Baldwin
 to the said Ariana Jennings together with all and singular the Privileges
 and Appurtenances to each of the said Tracts belonging to have to hold the
 same with the Appurtenances unto the said Wm Stephenson his heirs assigns
 forever In Witness whereof the said Parties to these presents have
 hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year first above written
