

KNOW all Men by these presents that whereas I James Gibson of Prince Georges County Planter and do stand justly Indebted unto Saul Dulany of Annapolis in Forty three Pounds fifteen Shillings Sterling for which I have past my bond of this Date. The said James Gibson in Consideration thereof for the better Security of this money have Assigned set over & Transferred and by these presents do Assign set over & Transfer unto the said Saul Dulany his heirs &c. or Assigns so much of the money to receive & owing from Patrick Andrew of Prince Georges County as Adm. of Honalls Wood lately Deceased (as I do hereby fully Authorize & Impower the said Saul Dulany whom for this purpose I constitute & appoint my atty. & procuor to use all Lawfull ways to recover or to recover the same) as shall be sufficient to satisfy & Discharge this sum of forty three pounds fifteen Shillings Sterling and any Interest that may be due for the same & hereby Covenant & Agree not to refuse or Discharge the said Debt or any other Debt whereby to hinder the said Saul Dulany from recovering the same & that I my heirs &c. shall hold this last Day of March Anno Domini 1732.
