 a dozen sup plates, One sup Dish, three Large  
 pewter Dishes, Half a dozen Good Chairs, One  
 Large Oval Table & One middling Dito Half  
 a dozen Good silver Spoons, One pair Large Brass  
 Candlesticks with Brass Snuffers & Stand Two good  
 Iron pots, Two Skewells & all my Dressing apparrell  
 One pair Large silver Shoe Buckles, with Knee  
 Buckles & Stock Buckle all of silver, One Large  
 silver Watch with the Name West on it and  
 One pair of Good Buttons, as also the sume of  
 One Hundred and Forty pounds Current money  
 of Maryland. To Have and to Hold the  
 aforesaid Two negroes and money and all other  
 the aforesaid premises unto the said  
 William Merritt, His Executors Admin<sup>rs</sup> or assigns.  
 to his or their Own proper use or use of Heirs  
 for Ever, Freely & Quietly without any manner  
 of Challenge Claim or Demand of me the said  
 William Merritt or of any other person or  
 persons what soever for me and in my name  
 by any cause or procurement & without any money  
 or other thing to be yeilded payed or done unto  
 me the said William Merritt my Executors  
 Administrators or assigns In Witness  
 whereof I have shd remts set my hand  
 and seal this fourth day of february Anno
