the Sum of eight hundred & twenty pound five Shillings & seven
Pence Due from the^{said} Samuel Groom the Younger to the^{said} Levin
Donwood & then unsatisfied unto the^{said} Betty Gale & Levin Gale
his Executors it was amongst other things enacted that M^r Thomas
Worthington, M^r Walter Smith & M^r Roger Mathews or any two
of them whereby the^{said} Act Impowered & Appointed Commissioners
or Trustees on the Western Shore to Sell & Dispose to the best Biddor
