 & to ask Demand recover & receive whatever Debts & Credits which
 whilst living & at the time of his Death did any way belong to his
 Estate & to pay whatever Debts the said Decedent at the time of his
 Death did owe so far as such Goods Chattles & Credits will
 thereto extend & the Law requires you being first Sworn
 well & faithfully to Administer the same & also to make a true
 & perfect Inventory of all & singular the said Goods Chattles & Credits
 & exhibit the same into the Registry of our Prerogative Court of
 Canterbury on or before the last Day of February Next ensuing and
 also to render a just & true Account thereof on or before the last
 Day of August which shall be in the Year of our Lord one
 thousand seven hundred thirty four & we do by Virtue of these
 Presents Ordain & constitute you Deputy of all & singular
 the Goods Chattles & Credits of the said Decedent Given at London
 the third Day of August in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven
 hundred thirty three & in the eighteenth Year of our
 Translation Linthwaite Parrant Deputy &
 Registrar of our Prerogative Court of Canterbury
