Twenty pounds Sterling money of Great Britain in full for the Confiration  
of the Land & premises within mentioned W<sup>m</sup> Rawlings —

Test Henry Hooper } May 6<sup>th</sup> 1737 then came the within  
Rich<sup>d</sup> Goldsmith } Named William Rawlings before me the  
Subscriber, one of his Lordships Justices of the peace, Court &  
Acknowledged the within Deed to be his Act & Deed & the Land  
& premises therein mentioned to be the Right & Estate of the within  
Named Vachel. Denton, his heirs & assigns for ever, And at the  
Same time came Elizabeth Rawlings Wife of the said William  
Rawlings who being by me privately Examined out of the hearing of  
her said husband Declared that she gave up all her Right of Dower  
to the Land & premises within mentioned & Acknowledged the same  
to be the Right & Estate of the within Named Vachel. Denton, his  
heirs & assigns for ever & that she made this said Acknowledgment  
Willingly & freely & without being induced thereto by fears or threats  
of or ill usage by her husband or fear of his Displeasure According to the  
True intent & meaning of the within Deed & the Act of Assembly of —  
this province in such cases made & provided Taken & Acknowledged  
the Day & Year above mentioned before Henry Hooper  
Rosed May the 11<sup>th</sup> 1737 of Mr. Vachel. Denton for his Lordships  
Use the sum of Six Shillings Sterling being the Abolition fine  
on the within mentioned One hundred & fifty Acres of Land by  
Virtue of a Commission from Benjamin Lasher Esq. Agent  
& Receiver Generall to his said Lordship  
Recorded the 12<sup>th</sup> May 1737 W<sup>m</sup> Rawlings
