This Indenture made the twentieth Day of November Anno Domini 1731 Between William Stavelly at present in the Province of Maryland but late of London Gent of the One part and Benjamin Tasher of the said Province Esq: of the Other part Witnesseth that the said William Stavelly for in Consideration of the Sum of Three Hundred pounds Stere to the said William Stavelly by the said Benjamin Tasher at or before the sealing and Delivery of these presents paid or caused to be paid hath granted bargained sold Alien released Enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents doth fully absolutely Grant Bargain Sell Alien Release Enfeoff and Confirm unto the said Benjamin Tasher his heirs and assigns forever All that part of all that manor containing Two Thousand Acres of Land more or less commonly called or known by the name of Kent Fort manor situate lying and being in the Southernmost End of Kent Island in Queen Anns County in the said Province of Maryland and which was conveyed by Thomas Bladen of London Gent son and heir of William Bladen late of the (said)
