This Indenture made the Twelfth day of June anno Domini One Thousand Seven hundred and Thirty One Between Thomas Linticum Junr. of Ann Arundell County in the Province of Maryland Planter of the One part and Richard Taylor Junr. of the said County and Province Carpenter of the Other part Witnesseth that the said Thomas Linticum for and in Consideration of the Summe of Twelve pounds ten Shillings Current Money of the Province aforesaid to him in hand paid by the said Richard Taylor at and before the sealing of these presents the Receipt whereof he the said Thomas Linticum doth hereby Acknowledge and himself therewith to be fully satisfied Contented and paid and thereof and of Every part & parcel thereof doth Acquitt Exonerate and Discharge the said Richard Taylor his heirs and assigns for ever that he given Granted Bargained sold assigned Aliened enfeoffed Transferred and Confirmed and by these presents doth give Grant Bargain Sell assign Aliene Enfeoff Transferr and Confirme unto him the said Richard Taylor his heirs and assigns for ever all that piece or parcel of Land being part or parcel of a Tract of Land called Smiths Forrest lying in Baltimore County in the woods on the North Side of Patuxent River on Hunting Ridge Beginning at a Bounded Red Oak being the Original beginning Boundary of the said Smiths Forrest and also abounded Tree of two parcels of Land formerly belonging to James Murry and William Slade and running from thence South West forty four perches. to (Thomas)
