

Maryland<sup>r</sup> This Indenture made this eighteenth Day of July  
Anno Dom<sup>i</sup> One thousand Seven hundred & forty Between William  
Boole of London in Ann Arundell County Merchant of the one  
part & William Cumming of the City of Annapolis & County af<sup>o</sup> Gent  
& Richard Snowden of the County af<sup>o</sup> Merchant of this other part  
Witnesseth that whereas the said William Cumming & Richard  
Snowden at the Special Instance & request of the af<sup>o</sup> William  
Boole as principal together with John Welsh Richard Hill & Robert  
Boole as Securities became bound jointly & severally with the  
William Boole to the Right Honourable the Lord Propy of this Province  
in the sum of thirty thousand pounds Sterling Money in a  
certain Bond or Obligation bearing Date the second Day of  
July Anno Dom<sup>i</sup> One thousand Seven hundred thirty & three  
Conditioned that if the said William Boole Administrator of the  
goods & Chattels of Samuel Boole his Brother Dec<sup>d</sup> should make  
a true & perfect Inventory of the goods & Chattels of the Dec<sup>d</sup>  
together with a list of separate & Dependent Debts return the same  
(into)
