 Assignes according to the true Intent & meaning of the same Deed  
 & the Act of Assembly in that Case made & provided And the said Hollen  
 being privately examined out of the hearing of her husband declar-  
 ed that she acknowledged the same of her own free Consent without  
 being induced thereto by fears or threats or ill Usage from her said  
 husband or fear of his Displeasures — Taken & acknowledged the  
 Day & Year above written before me the Subscriber one of his Lord-  
 ships Justices of the Provincial Court of the Province of  
 Recorded Feb<sup>y</sup> 26<sup>th</sup> 1740 Robert Gordon

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This Indenture made the twenty fifth Day of February in the Year  
 of our Lord Seventeen hundred & forty four Between Thomas —  
 Lewis of Ann Arundell County Planter & Elizabeth his Wife lately —  
 Elizabeth Bigdall Grand Daughter of Hollen Campbell late of said  
 County deceased which said Hollen Campbell was Wife of a certain Robert  
 Tubb & after his Decease married to a certain John Campbell late of  
 said County deceased of the one part & John Brice of the af<sup>d</sup> County  
 Gentleman of the other part Witnesseth that the said Thomas Lewis  
 & Elizabeth his Wife for & in Consideration of the Sum of Sixty pounds  
 Current Money of Maryland & two hundred & fifty pounds of Tobacco  
 to them in hand paid or to be paid the Receipt whereof they  
 the said Thomas & Elizabeth heroby acknowledge & the roof of every  
 part & parcel thereof do acquit & discharge the said John Brice have  
 given granted bargained sold aliened Infeoffed & confirmed & by  
 these presents for themselves their Heirs Executors & Adors do give  
 Grant bargain sell alien Infeoffe & confirm unto him the said  
 John Brice his Heirs & Assignes All that Tract or parcel of Land called  
 Lusby Originally taken up by Robert Lusby late of the County af<sup>d</sup>  
 & containing fifty Acres of Land more or less which said Tract of  
 Land
