of June in the Year of Our Lord God one Thousand seven hundred  
forty six Between William Mattingly of Baltimore County  
Plaintiff of the one Part and Thomas Johnson of the same County  
Defendant of the other Part Witnesseth that the said William  
Mattingly for in Consideration of the full Sum of forty pounds  
Sterling Money (to him in hand paid or secured to be paid by him  
the said Thomas Johnson at or before the Envoaling & delivery of  
these Presents, whereby & wherewith he the said William doth  
acknowledge himself to be these Presents fully Content, & thereof  
goodly part thereof, doth hereby acquit, exonerate, & discharge  
the said Thomas Johnson his heirs & assigns forever) hath  
Given granted, Bargained, sold, aliened, enfeoffed & Consumed &  
by these Presents doth Give, Grant, Bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff  
& Confirmed by, date, give, grant, bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff  
& Confirm unto him the said Thomas Johnson his heirs &  
assigns, all that parcel of Land Called Turners Hall, lying  
in Baltimore County, being Beginning at a bound, to w<sup>ch</sup> Cat  
& running South by East Two hundred Poles to a Round  
Clink in a Branch, then West by South one hundred & thirty poles  
to a bound Black Oak on a Level, then North, West two hundred  
poles then to the first Tree, containing Two Hundred Acres  
of Land more or less: and also all that parcel of Land Called  
Blascut Green, being part of a tract of Land called
