

This Indenture made the Eleventh Day of
 November Anno Domini One thousand seven hundred and
 Forty five among His Majesty's High Court of Chancery
 dooing Writ, Between William Thornton of Anno Arundell
 County in the Province of Maryland Merchant on the one part
 and Stephen Hall & Henry Darnall both of Boston in the County
 of Suffolk & Province of the Massachusetts Bay in New Eng:
 Merchants of the other part Witnesseth That the said William
 Thornton for his Consideration of the Sum of Four hundred
 & Twenty Eight pounds Eleven Shilling & Six pence Sterling to
 him in hand at and before the Ensigning & Delivery a hereof
 well & Truly paid by the said Stephen Hall & Henry Darnall
 The Receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge and thereof
 doth acquit & discharge the said Stephen Hall & Henry Darnall
 their heirs Executors and Assigns and every of them forever by
 these presents to have given granted bargained sold Released
 conveyed Confirmed & by these presents to do fully
 & Absolutely Give grant Bargain sold Release & Confirm
 Convey & Confirm unto the said Stephen Hall & Henry
 Darnall their heirs & Assigns forever All that Manor
 called the Manor of Westbury Situate lying & being on
 the East Side of St. Georges Creek in Maryland being all
 those two Parcels of Land mentioned & described in & by
 one certain Grant or Patent from the said Baltimore unto
 Thomas Weston Gentleman bearing date the Tenth day
 of January Anno Domini 1642 Signed by Leonard Calvert
 Esq: One of which Two Pieces of Land containeth Twelve
 hundred Acres more or less The other Piece containing
 fifty Acres more or less as the same stand Enrolled in
 the Records in St. Marys County by Thomas Brooke Clerk
 To have and to hold the said two Pieces of Land
 with all the Rights & Appurtenances thereof unto them
 the said Stephen Hall & Henry Darnall their heirs &
 Assigns forever Subject Nevertheless to all such Tenants
 Services and Acknowledgments as are owing in the fore routes
