 in hand paid by the said Daniel Cheston the Receipt whereof he doth hereby
 Acknowledge and thereof and of and from every part and parcel thereof
 doth Acquit Conquerate and Discharge him the said Daniel Cheston his
 heirs Executors and Adm^rs. he the said Thomas Bordley hath given Grant
 Bargained Sold Aliened Enfeoffed Assign^d Released Confirmed and
 forever Quitclaim and by these presents for himself his heirs Executors and
 Adm^rs. Doth give Grant bargain Sell Alien Enfeoff^d Release Confirm^d
 forever Quitclaim unto him the said Daniel Cheston his heirs Assign^d
 forever all that Tract or parcel of Land lying in Cecil County a^s called
 Tristris Farm containing (by Patent granted to James Tristby of the
 County a^s.) Three hundred Acres of Land more or less also part of a tract
 of Land called Tristby's prime choice lying in the County a^s. Adjoin-
 ing to the said Tract called Tristby's Farm being bulled and Bounded
 as follows (viz.) beginning at a ^{Bounded} Locust post placed instead of the Original
 marked White Oak the Beginning Tree of the said Tristby's Prime
 Choice by the Commissioners appointed by the Justices of Cecil County
 Court to perpetuate the Bounds of the a^s. Lands the said Bounded
 Locust post standing by the side of white Marsh which said Marsh
 being at the head of a creek called the Scotchman's Creek and Runing
 from the said Locust Post South Seventy one Degree West Ninety four
 Perches & half a perch to a Locust post then North fifty eight degrees
 West Sixty eight Perches to another Locust post and from thence
 with a straight line to another Locust post placed at the end of the
 North and by West line of Thomas Davisi's Land called the Levil
 then with the said Levil South and by East to a Bounded Locust Post
 in the said line of the Tract of Land called the Levil placed by the
 Commissioners a^s. instead of a Hickory the second Boundary of the
 a^s. Tract of Land called Tristby's Farm and from thence with the
 said ^{Land} called Tristby's Farm Reversing the first course thereof to the
 Beginning
