This Indenture made the Seventh day of July 1747
Between Henry Semans of Kent County in the Province of Maryland
Planter of the one part and Edmund Jennings of the City of Annapolis
Esq^r of the Other part Witnesseth that the said Henry Semans for and
in consideration of Twenty one Ounces Eleven penny eighteen grains
of Spanish Gold amounting in Value to One hundred and Nineteen
Shillings of Maryland Gold Currency to him the said Henry Semans by
the said Edmund Jennings at or before the sealing hereof paid and satis-
fied the Receipt whereof he doth hereby Acknowledge Hath granted
Bargained and Sold and by these Presents Doth Grant Bargain
and Sell unto the said Edmund Jennings All that Tract or parcel
of Land called Bright Horstone Situate lying and being in
Kent County a^{fo} Beginning at a corner marked Rich Heecory stand-
ing on the South side of Choplank Road and near the head of a Branch
belonging to a small River called the Mill Branch and Running
from the said Tree South East four hundred Paces then with a Line
Drawn North East four hundred paces and from thence with a
Line drawn North West four hundred Paces and from thence with
a Line Drawn to the aforementioned Rich Heecory containing and
Laid out for one Thousand Acres of Land more or less (excepting out
of the a^{fo} Tract the Quantity of Fifty five Acres of Land part thereof
which is included in a certain Tract of Land called Ballams
folly being an Antient Survey) To have and to hold the said
One Thousand Acres of Land (Except as before excepted) unto
the said Edmund Jennings his heirs and Assigns forever
(Provided)
