 same County on Saturday the first day of August in the Twenty  
 first year of the Reign of our said Sovereign Lord George the King  
 of Great Britain & Before Sir Thomas Burchett Knight one of  
 the Justices of his Majesty's Court of Common Pleas and Edward  
 Clive Esq. one of the Barons of his Majesty's Court of Exchequer  
 Justice & Presenting that Richard Chamberlain William Sawyer  
 James Sawyer and James Clerk were at a former Session of Goal  
 Delivery convicted for Felonies for which they were excluded the  
 Benefit of Clergy and to whom his Majesty had been graciously  
 pleased to extend his Royal Mercy on Condition of Transporta-  
 -on to some part of America for the Term of fourteen years and that  
 such his Intentions of Mercy had been signified by the Right Honble  
 Philip Carteret of Chesterfield one of his Majesty's Principal Sec-  
 -taries of State Pursuant to the Directions of <sup>the</sup> Act of Parliament  
 made in the fourth year of the Reign of his late Majesty King  
 George Intitled an Act for the further preventing Robbery Bur-  
 -glary and other Felonies and for the more Effectual Transporta-  
 -tion of Felons and unlawfull Exporters of Wool and for Declaring  
 the Law in some points relating to Pirates the said Court did thereby  
 Order the Transportation of the said Felons
