7<sup>d</sup> This Indenture made this eight day of April in this Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and fifty one Between William Hutchman of Cecil County in the Province of Maryland Gentleman of the one part and Anthony Smith of the same County Gentleman of the other part Witnesseth that the said William Hutchman for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred pounds Current Money the Receipt whereof the said Hutchman doth hereby Acknowledge and thereof doth acquit and Discharge the said Smith his Heirs Executors and Administrators for ever hath Granted Bargained sold Aliened Released Enfeoffed and Confirmed and by these presents for himself and his Heirs doth clearly and absolutely Grant Bargain sell Alien Enfeoff Release and Confirm unto the said Anthony Smith his Heirs and Assigns forever part of a Tract of Land called Holland lying and being on the East side of Susquehanna River in Cecil County beginning at a Oak being the extent of an East line drawn from a poplar standing on a high stone hill the Northern most corner

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
