 by such Sale Provided that the said several and Respective Creditors of the said William
 Cumming the Elder shall and are willing to accept and take an equal and
 Proportionable part of the said Money arising by the Sale of the said Land and Tenement
 Goods and Chattels In Witness whereof the Parties to these Presents have hereunto
