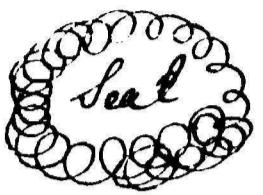

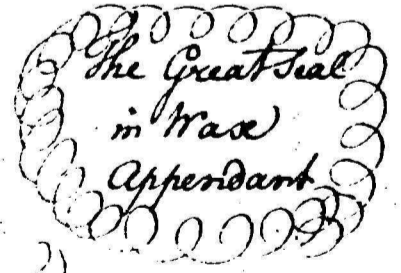

2 Maryland s^t Charles Absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Provinces of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore &c. To all our Bailiffs and good People to whom these Presents shall come Greeting Whereas John Jenner of Annapolis County Labourer the servant of a certain Philip Warfield of the said County is detained in our Gaol at the City of Annapolis for certain Crimes by him committed NOW KNOW YE that for Divers Causes and Considerations Us thereunto moving We have Pardoned and We do by these Presents Pardon release and remit unto him the said John Jenner all Pains Penalties and Forfeitures which by Law he may be liable or subject to for or by Reason of the said Crimes And We do also grant unto him the said John Jenner our firm Peace and will not that he suffer any Corporal Punishment therefore But that he shall stand and be in the same Blight State and Condition to all Intents and Purposes as if the said Crimes had by him never been done or committed Witness our Trusty and Well beloved Samuel Ogle Esq^r Governor and Commander in Chief in and over our said Province this 12th Day of September in the 37th Year of our Dominion Annoque Domini 1751
