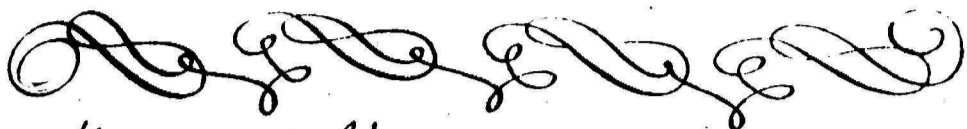

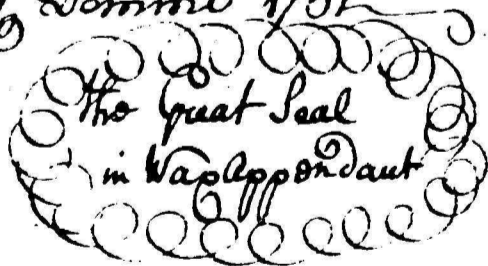
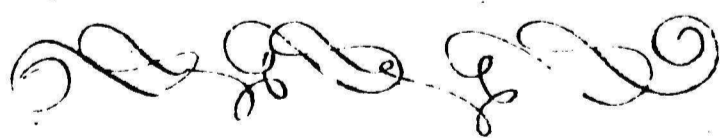

Charles absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Province of Maryland & Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore &c. To all our Bailiffs and Good People to whom these Presents shall come greeting Know ye that of our Especial Grace We have Pardoned unto John Mac Carmick of Cecil County Labourer as a proper Object of our Mercy the Suit of our Peace and whatever appertaineth unto us for ^{that} the said John Mac Carmick heretofore viz^t on the Nineteenth day of May in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and fifty one at Cecil County aforesaid the Mansion House of a certain John Davidge of the same County Planter with Force and Arms in the Afternoon to wit between the Hours of one and two of the Clock after the Noon of the same day no Person in the said House then being Feloniously Broke and Entered and one Mans Cloth Coat of the Value of Twenty Shilling Sterling One Mans Cloth Jacket of the Value of fifteen Shillings like Money one Mans Duffell Great Coat of the Value of Twenty Shillings like Money one Pair of Leather Breeches of the Value of Ten Shillings like Money one Pair of Check Trowsers of the Value of two Shillings like Money and one Case Bottle containing therein one Quart of Melapes of the Value of two Shillings like Money of the goods and Chattels of the aforesaid John Davidge in the said Mansion House then being then and there Feloniously stole took and carried away against our Peace good rule and Government and contrary to the Form of the Statute in such Cases lately made and provided whereof he was Convict before the Justices of our Provincial Court Nevertheless We Grant unto him our firm Peace and will not that he suffer any Corporal Punishment therefore but that he shall stand and be in the same (light) State and Condition to all Intents and Purposes as if the said Felony whereof the said John Mac Carmick hath been Convict had never been done or committed Witness our Trusty and Wellbeloved Samuel Ogle Esq^r Governor of our said Province this 20th Day of September in the 9th Year of our Dominion Anno Domini 1751
