Ex<sup>ra</sup> This Indenture made this Twentieth day of October in the Year of our Lord Christ One Thousand seven hundred and fifty one Between Isaac Freeman of Kent County in Maryland Planter of the one part and Andrew Pearce of the same County (Planter) of the other part Wherein the said Isaac Freeman in September (Term last past) did Commence Prosecute and bring one Writ of Entry per Disseisin in the Provincial Court of Maryland and against the same Andrew Pearce thereby demanding all that Tract or Parcel of Land called Harshby Point lying and being in Kent County and beginning at a bounded Locust Post standing on the East side of the Mouth of a Creek of Sapprass River formerly called Jacksons Creek being the place where the Original beginning Cedar stood and running from the said Post South East three hundred and six Perches which comes to a Creek called Darwallis's Creek mentioned in the Original Grant then down with the same North nineteen Degrees East forty two Perches then North fifty eight Degrees East forty Perches then East twenty Perches then North (Twenty)
