 Whereas Benjamin Stoddart Gent<sup>l</sup> by his Dood Indented and duly Executed on the eighteenth day of August One Thousand Seven hundred and forty six) did Convey and make over to the S<sup>r</sup> George Gordon and his Heirs four hundred Acres of Land to be laid off on the South end of that Six hundred Acres of Land being the Dividend or part belonging to the S<sup>r</sup> Benjamin Stoddart of a Tract called Friendship being now in Frederick County formerly lying in Prince Georges County the said Tract being Originally Granted to Col<sup>l</sup> Thomas Addison and James Stoddart  
 And Whereas the said George Gordon by his Dood Indented and duly Executed on the Twenty seventh day of December in the Year One Thousand Seven hundred and fifty did Convey and make over the above mentioned four hundred Acres of Land to the S<sup>r</sup> James Dick Attorney in Fact to William Black Merchant in London for certain Uses Trusts & Purposes mentioned and expressed in the said Dood reference being thereunto had which will more fully appear.
