Courses of the part of Friendship laid out by Isaac Brookes for G Gordon and now sold to Mr. Henry Threlkeld Beginning at a Bounded Black Oak standing on the North side of a Marsh called Apple Tree Marsh it being the nearest Marsh or Glade up the Main Road from Geo. Busey's to Munockrosy and also a Dividing Tree between Mof's Addition and Hodder's of the said Tract of Land called Friendship Running thence North 18^o 4. Perches N. W. by 17 50 Perches N. W. 80 Perches S 32 West 20 Perches S 55 W. 94 Perches S 74 W 191 Perches S. like Degrees E 162 Perches then by a straight line to the Beginning tree containing 4. now laid out for four hundred Acres of Land April 17th 1751. Platted by a Scale of 100 Equal Parts in an Inch by Isaac Brookes

This Indenture made the fourth day of March in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and fifty three Between Job Evans of Baltimore County Planter of the one part and Caleb Dorsey of Annapundel County Gent. of the other part Witnesseth that the said Job Evans for and in Consideration of the Sum of Ten Pounds Current Money to him in hand paid by the said Caleb Dorsey the Receipt whereof is hereby Acknowledged Hath Bargained and sold and by those Presents Doth Bargain and sell unto, the said Caleb Dorsey and his Heirs a Tract or Parcel of Land called Timber Ridge lying in Baltimore County but now in Frederick County lying the North side of Patapsco Barrens Beginning at two Bounded White Oaks and a Bounded Maple being Bounded Trees of a Tract of Land called Halls Range and running thence North fifty Degrees West fourteen Perches then North twenty Degrees East twenty Perches then North fifty Degrees West fourteen Perches then South twenty Degrees West twenty Perches then North fifty Degrees West Seventy eight Perches then North twenty Degrees East One hundred and ten Perches then South Seventy Degrees East (thirty)
