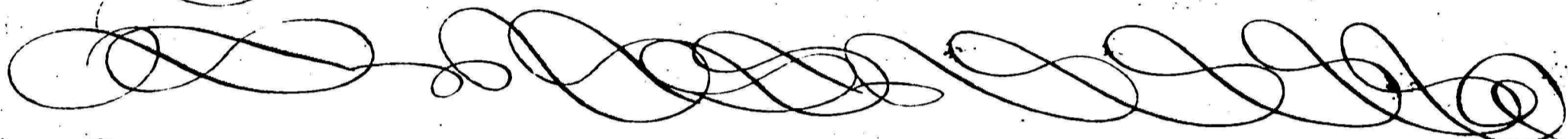

Ex^o This Indenture made the sixteenth Day of April in the year of our Lord
One thousand seven hundred and fifty five Between John Tomison
of S^t Marys County in the Province of Maryland Planter and Susannah
his Wife of the one part and John Attaway ^(Clerk) of the same County and
Province of Gentleman of the other Witnesseth that the said John
Tomison and Susannah his Wife for and in consideration of the sum
of Two Shillings current Money to them in hand paid the receipt
whereof is hereby acknowledged Have granted Bargained and
Sold and by these presents Do Grant Bargain and Sell unto the said
John Attaway Clerk his Executors Administrators & assigns the several
Moieties parts or parcels of Land following that is to say one Moiety
of a Tract of Land called the out-let containing fifty acres more or
less also one other Moiety of a Tract or parcel of Land called Red-
mans adventure containing fifty acres more or less which said Moieties
or Parcels of Land are situate lying and being in S^t Marys County
at near the Head of Poplar Hill Creek and was formerly sold or
conveyed by Andrew Delawans and Ann his wife to a certain Sam^l
Johnson and also all that tract or parcel of Land called Mulberry
Fields lying in the same County contained in the following metes
and Bounds Beginning at a bounded Chesnut standing on the
South Side of the Land whereupon Samuel Johnson formerly
lived and Running South to a Poplar in the line of Robert Maffay
