Benjamin Taster Junr. of the City of Annapolis Esq. and John Profs of the same City Gentlemen are held and firmly bound unto the Right Honourable Frederick Absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Province of Maryland in the full and Just sum of One Thousand pounds current Money to be paid to his said Lordship his heirs and Successors to which payment well and and truly to be made and done We bind Ourselves and each of us Our and each of Our heirs Executors and Administrators, Jointly and severally for the whole and in the whole formly by these presents Sealed with Our seals and dated this 17th day of January Anno Domini 1756

The condition of the above Obligation is such that if the above bound Benjamin Taster Senr. whilst he shall continue in the Office of Commissary General shall at his own proper cost and charge find a supply of good and sufficient Record Books Necessary for the entering up all Matters and things relating to such Commissarys Office and shall duly and carefully look after preserve and maintain all the several Books of Record now being and remaining in the said Office as also those that from time to time shall be added thereto in such Manner as that when he shall be dismissed from [officiating]
