Commons Court of this Province, Reservem being thereto —  
had well more fully and at large appear to have and  
to hold the said several Tracts and Parcels of Land  
above mentioned and every part and Parcel thereof, with  
the Appurtenances unto the said Thomas Brewster his  
Heirs and assigns forever to the Intent and Purpose that  
the said Thomas Brewster shall and may become perfect  
tenant to the freehold of the said Lands and Premises &  
shall and may stand and be seized thereof unto a good  
and Perfect Common Recovery with Double Vouchers over
