the Year of our Lord God Seventeen Hundred and forty and Four
Between William Worthington Junior of Baltimore County
Gentleman of the one part and John Worthington his father
of Ann Arundel County of the other part Witnesseth that the
said William Worthington for and in Consideration of the
sum of five hundred and fifty four pounds Sterling money
of Great Britain to him in hand paid by the said John Worthington
the receipt whereof he doth hereby Acknowledge and
hereof and of Every part or parcel thereof doth acquit and
Discharge the said John Worthington his Executors and Adm^{rs}
to the said William Worthington hath given Granted Bargained
and sold and confirmed by these Presents for himself his
his Executors and Administrators doth give Grant Bargain
sell alien and confirm unto him the said John Worthington
his heirs and assigns for ever the Negroes and Stocks
hereafter mentioned (to wit) Sixteen Negroe men named
Jack, Sarcay, Cassor, Hector, Robin, London, Peter, Dick,
Peter, Cook, Bristow, Pompe, Bowen, Adam, Brown, and
Lewis. Ten negroe women named Rachael, Fanny,
Jannona, See! Schofield, Mary, Ruth, Hannah, Moea (Coo
thirteen Negroe children named Moe, Rachael, See, Nann,
James, Toby, Jack, Will, Tom, Sam, Dick, Bristow and
Adam in all thirty nine Negroes and molatto Slaves Eighty
three head of Cattle (to wit) Twenty Eight Cows, fourteen
Young Steers Eighteen Young Heifers. Six old Steers thirteen
(Yearlings)
