unto my said Grand Father John Worthington his heirs & assigns  
for ever so that Neither I the said John Worthington Son of  
William nor my heirs nor any other Person or persons for me  
or them shall or will by any way or means hereafter have  
Claim Challenge or Demand any Estate Right Title or Interest  
of in or to the aforesaid Premises or any part or parcel thereof  
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed  
my Seal this Eighteenth Day of April Anno Dom. 1757
