 Paid to the said Lord Proprietor his heirs or Successors to the which payment  
 well and truly to be made we do bind our selves our heirs Executors  
 and administrators for the whole and in the whole jointly and severally  
 jointly by these presents sealed with our seals and dated this fourth  
 Day of September anno Domini 1756

The Condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound  
 Colmore Beanes whilst he shall continue in the office of Receiver  
 of the Land Tax in Prince Georges County shall well and truly  
 Execute and Perform the several Duties Required of him to be performed  
 by the act of assembly of this Province Entitled and Act for granting  
 a supply of forty thousand Pounds for his Majesty service & for raising  
 thirty four thousand & fifteen Pounds six shillings thereof in Bills of  
 Credit & raising a fund for sinking the same and do well & faithfully  
 Pay to the Commissioners of the Loan office for the time being  
 sums of money which he shall receive or be answerable for in virtue  
 of the same Act at such times as by the said act is Directed according  
 to the true Intent and meaning thereof then the above obligation to be  
 void and of no effect otherwise to remain in full force and virtue
