

Dwelling House where Charles Hornwood did live and in a site almost at the head of  
 said Cove The middle of the house that fronts the Water bears from the said Stone North Twenty  
 seven Degree forty five Minutes West Then running from the said Stone a ~~drop~~ Hornwood's Lot with  
 a line drawn North Twenty five degrees East Three hundred and Seventy three perches to another ~~stone post~~  
 bounded with four Notches and marked 1722. herefore planted in the very spot where the original  
 marked Chestnut mentioned in the patent that was granted for Hornwood's Lot in sixteen hundred  
 and Sixty three referred to in the patent granted Seventeen hundred and thirty five did stand and close  
 to which said post standing near the head of a Branch of Maggody Creek there is now fixed a Stone  
 where on are graven these Words "The End of H.S. and I.H.'s divid<sup>d</sup> Line also a Bound<sup>d</sup> of  
 Hornwood's Lot" then from the said locus spot so marked with four Notches or last mentioned Stone  
 running South Twenty Six degrees East Seventy ~~perches~~ and three quarters of a perch (such being the  
 true Course and Distance tho' it is different from the Course and distance mentioned in the patent for  
 Hornwood's Lot granted in Seventeen hundred and thirty five) to a Stone whereon are graven these  
 Words "Here stood In<sup>d</sup> Hornwood's Pockery" now fixed in the very spot where the original  
 bounded Pockery mentioned in the patent that was granted for Hornwood's Lot in sixteen hundred  
 and Sixty three and referred to in the patent granted Seventeen hundred and thirty five did stand  
 The said Pockery being fallen down and almost decayed, then from the said Stone marked  
 as aforesaid running agreeable to the Courses mentioned in the Certificate of Survey of  
 Hornwood's Lot patented in Seventeen hundred and thirty five and according to the Location  
 and Expressions there of the several following Courses *Wit.* South West Twenty two perches,  
 To Intersect the Line of Pellibones Land thence with the said Land South East and by East Ninety  
 two perches to a Branch leading into Bwells Branch, thence bounding on the said Branch  
 running down these Nine Courses following that is South Seventy Degree East ten perches  
 South fifty degree East thirty two perches, South Sixty degree East Eighteen perches  
 North Eighty Eight degree East fourteen perches, South Seventy five degree East fourteen  
 perches, North Seventy Nine degree East thirteen perches and a half perch, North twenty  
 degree East Ten perches, North Eighty two Degree East twelve perches, North Eighty  
 five
