

mentioned in the Patent for Homewood's Lot granted in seventeen hundred and thirty five to a Stone whereon are graven these Words "Here stood Mr. Homewood's Pochicory" now fixed in the very spot where the original bounded Pochicory mentioned in the patent that was granted for Homewood's Lot in sixteen hundred and forty three and referred to in the patent granted seventeen hundred and forty five did stand. the said Pochicory being fallen down and almost decayed then from the said stone mark as aforesaid running agreeable to the Courses mentioned in the Certificate of Survey of Homewood's Lot patented in seventeen hundred and thirty five and according to the Location and Expressions there of the several following Courses viz South West Twenty two perches to intersect the Line of Pettibones Land thence with the said Land South East and by East ninety two perches to a Branch leading into Burles' Branch, thence bounding on the said Branch running down these Nine Courses following That is South Seventy degrees East ten perches, South fifty degrees East thirty two perches, South Sixty degrees East eighteen perches, North eighty eight degrees East fourteen perches, South Seventy five degrees East fourteen perches North Twenty Nine degrees East thirteen perches and a half perch North Twenty Degrees East Ten perches North Eighty Two Degrees East Twelve perches, North Eighty five degrees East Twenty perches into a Swamp of Burles Pond, thence South thirteen degrees East thirteen perches to the Land formerly Surveyed for Robert Burle then with the said Burles' Land South South West One hundred and thirteen perches to the Land formerly Surveyed for Major Richard Ewin, thence with the said Ewin's Land South Seventy Seven Degrees West One hundred and Fifty Eight perches to a Bounded Cedar Post set up at the very spot where it was prov'd the original Market Beginning of Ewin's Land stood, by the side of which Cedar post there is now fixed a Stone whereon are graven these Words "Here stood Richd. Ewin's Pochicory" still running with the said Land South Ten degrees West forty perches South and by East thirty one perches, thence by a straight line to the first Beginning stone marker
