 any fee or Reward whatsoever for any Service I shall do as Clerk of the Said Office
 And also that in making out the Office Fees I will not Wittingly or Willingly Charge
 other or higher Fees than Limited by the Act Constituted an Act for amending the
 Staple of Tobacco for preventing Frauds in his Majesty's Customs and for Limitation
 of Officers Fees
