 Widow of Samuel Gaither of the one part, & Charles Ridgely Junr of Baltimore County
 of the other part. Witnesseth that the aforesaid Ann Gaither for & in Consideration of
 the full and just sum of one hundred Pounds Sterling money of Great Britain to her the
 said Ann Gaither already in hand paid the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged &
 wch part & parcel thereof doth hereby Acquit & Discharge the said Charles Ridgely
 his heirs & Assigns for ever, And by these presents the said Ann Gaither hath
 given
