Came before us the Subscribers two of his Lordships Justices of the Peace for Prince Georges County the within named Mullettson Parker and Althea his Wife and James Marshall and did severally acknowledge the within Deed to be their Act and Deed and the Lands Negroes Goods and Chattels therein mentioned to be the Right Estate and Property of the within named James Marshall his Heirs Executors and Admors to and for the Uses Intents and Purposes within mentioned And the said Althea being by us privately examined apart from and out of the hearing of her said Husband did make and repeat such her Acknowledgment and did declare that she made this her acknowledgment freely and voluntarily without being induced thereto by fears or threats of or Ill usage from her said Husband or for fear of his Displeasure

This Indenture made the Fourteenth day of February in the Year of our Lord sixteen hundred and sixty four Between Rachel Worthington of Baltimore County in the Province of Maryland Gentleman of the one Part and Samuel Worthington of the same County and Province Gentleman of the other Part Witnesseth That for and in Consideration of the sum of Five shillings Current Money by him the said Samuel Worthington to him the said Rachel Worthington in hand Paid at or before the Sealing and Delivery of these Presents the Receipt whereof the said Rachel Worthington doth hereby Acknowledge and thereof and therefrom and of and from every Part and Part thereof doth hereby ~~acknowledge~~ ^{Release acquit} and Discharge the said Samuel Worthington his Heirs Executors and Administrators And also for and in Consideration of him the said Samuel Worthington being bound
