-Heirs and Assigns forever all the Right Title Claim & Estate which I  
-have or by any means may have of & into y<sup>e</sup> Messuages or Tenement within  
-or contiguous to the Town of Malbis with all the Houses Tenements Cottages  
-Meadows Meadow Grounds with their and each of their Appurtenances  
-on which were Demgd to me during my Natural Life by Daniel  
-Carroll of Upper Malbis ~~during my Natural Life~~ Prince Georges County  
-ty Deceased To have and to hold all the said Land & Premises Cottages  
-and Meadows & Meadow Grounds with their and each of their Appur-  
-tenances to him the said Daniel Carroll his Heirs and Assigns forever

-thirteenth of January Anno Domini seventeen hundred and sixty four
