

This Indenture made this thirtieth day of April in the Year of our Lord Christ sixteen hundred and Sixty four Between Joseph Gill of Dorchester County in the Province of Maryland Merchant of the one Part and William Brown of Anne Arundel County in the same Province Esquire Master of the <sup>other</sup> Part Witnesseth that the said Joseph Gill for and in Consideration of the sum of Four hundred and Twenty one Pounds and six Pence Sterling Money to him in Hand Paid by the said William Brown Paid before the sealing and Delivery of these Presents the receipt whereof the said Joseph Gill doth hereby Acknowledge and herefrom Acquit and Discharge the said William Brown his Heirs Executors and Administrators and every of them by these Presents Wholly given granted Bargained Sold Aligned released enloosed and Confirmed and by these Presents Doth <sup>give</sup> Grant Bargain <sup>sell</sup> Alien release enloose and perform unto him the said William Brown his Heirs and Assigns all that Tract of Land Called Dentons Holmes lying lately in Talbot County but <sup>in</sup> Dorchester County adjacent on the North side of the main stream of the North east Branch of Great Choptank River next above the Land of Colonel Vincent Lowe called Towsonfield Beginning at a White Oak by the Branch of the River near a Valley Marked with fifteen Notches Vizt five five and five being the Easternmost bounded Tree of Towsonfield thence running by the River side to another ~~Tree~~ Great White Oak marked five Notches two Notches and five Notches Standing by the bank of the River to the Eastward of a small Point and within a little Marshy Valley running along the Mouth of that little Point which last mentioned Oak stands One hundred and fifty Perches East from the first Oak and from that Oak Marked
