Articles of Agreement intended and made the thirtieth day
of April in the Year of our Lord one Thousand seven hundred and sixty
three Between Covetables Richardson of Tower Hill London Mer-
chant of the one Part and Charles Ridgely of Maryland in Ame-
rica Merchant of the other Part Witness as followeth, First it is
Agreed that the said Charles Ridgely is to have the Command of the
Ship the Royal Briton whereof the said Covetables Richardson is
Owner now in the River of Thames and bound on a Voyage to
Potomac River in Maryland and back to London and during
such Command to be Allowed the sum of Six Pounds per Month for
Wages Also it is Agreed that the said Charles Ridgely shall be Allow-
ed the benefit of the Stow and all (British) Stowage in the hold and between
Decks and in such Manner as shall not Detriment the Stowage of the
Ship's Cargo of Tobacco and also Passage and Portage

And also that all common and reasonable Charges and Expenses
paid laid out and expended by the said Charles Ridgely for the use

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
