Know all Men by these Presents that I Charles Drury of Ann arundel County Planter am held and firmly Bound unto Joseph Hutton of the County aforesaid Planter in the full and just sum of Five hundred pounds sterling money of Great Britain to the which payment to be well and truly made and done I bind myself my Heirs Executors or Administrators firmly by these presents sealed with my Seal and dated this seventeenth day of March Anno Domⁱ Seventeen hundred and sixty four. The Condition of the above Obligation is such that if the above bound Charles Drury his Heirs Executors or Administrators Do well and truly stand abide by and perform the Articles Contained in an Agreement made and drawn up on the seventeenth day of March seventeen hundred & sixty four by Joshua Griffith and Thomas Harwood Jun^r (at the Request and Consent of the aforesaid Charles Drury and Joseph Hutton) according to the true intend and meaning of the articles aforesaid that then the above Obligation to be Void and of none Effect otherwise to remain in full force and Virtue in Law Charles Drury Signed sealed and Delivered in the presents of, the words on the seventeenth day of March seventeen hundred and sixty four, being first interlined before signed, Tho^s Harwood Jun^r, Joshua Griffith

This Indenture made this Ninth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & sixty four Between Samuel Bottenger of Ann Arund^d County (son and heir at Law of Samuel Bottenger late of Prince Georges County deceased) of the one part and Robert Bottenger (son of the aforesaid Samuel Bottenger deceased) of the other part witnesseth that the said Samuel Bottenger for and in Consideration that Robert Tyler Grandfather of the Present Samuel Bottenger did by his Last Will and Testament bearing date on or about the Twenty Ninth day of December one thousand seven hundred and thirty five amongst other things give and bequeath unto his two Daughters Susannah Lamac and Elizabeth Bottenger all that two hundred acres of Land he had of a certain Benj^a Duwall called Howertons Range to be equally divided between them his said Daughter Susannah to have the Eastermost part and Elizabeth to have the Westernmost part of said Land to them his said Daughters and to the Surviving heirs of either of their said Bodys lawfully as for then for ever, and forasmuch as the said Robert Tyler did by his said last Will and Testament
