Yours of Oct<sup>b</sup> last received <sup>about</sup> a fortnight ago, & I should have answered it directly had I not been greatly indisposed I thank God I am now much better, I am still in the Isle of man, & have no hopes at present of leaving it, as my Husband has been gon from me about a twelve month, & I never since heard from, or of him so that I cant tell what part of the world he is in, or whether dead or alive, as for his relations they are like the generallity of the world after runing me dont think it worth their while to correspond with me, so that I may say that I & my poor Children are left to God, & the wide World - my Dr for I cant say any more in regard to your affair then what I have said before viz that all Deeds books, & papers of every kind belonging to your Father were by Lord Chancellors orders delivered to your Uncle
