 Will duly Executed and proved in the Prerogative Office of this
 Province (as will more fully appear by referring thereto) To have
 and to hold all and singular the above mentioned Lands and
 Premises with every of their Rights Members and Appurte-
 nances to him the said William Willson his heirs Execu-
 tors Administrators and assigns for ever, Together with
 all and singular the houses Gardens Orchardes, Tenures Profits
 Priviledges Advantages and Appurtenances whatsoever
 therunto belonging or in any way appertaining. And the
 said Jonathan Willson doth for himself his heirs Executors
 and Administrators and every of them Promise Grant and
 Agree to and with the said William Willson his heirs and assigns
 that he the said William Willson his heirs and assigns
 shall and may from time to time and at all times here-
 hereafter, Have, Hold, Occupy Possess and Enjoy all and singular
 the above mentioned Premises with every of their Rights Members
 and Appurtenances without the Eviction Molestation In-
 -ruption or Disturbance of him the said Jonathan Willson his heirs
 Executors or Administrators or any of them and
 only for use and behoof of him the said William
 Willson his heirs and assigns for ever (the Rents howsoever
 due hereafter to the Lord or Lords of the aforesaid Lands only
 excepted and forepassed) And lastly the said Jonathan Willson
 doth give Grant and Assigns against him the said
