This Indenture made the twelfth day of September in the Year of our Lord seventeen hundred and sixty two Between John Hammond and Ann his wife of Anne Arundel County in the Province of Maryland of the one Part and Benjamin Talbot of Mel County and Province aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said John Hammond and Ann his wife for and in Consideration of the sum of one hundred Pounds Current Money of Maryland to them in hand Paid at or before the sealing and Delivering of these Presents the Receipt Whereof they doth hereby acknowledge and thereof and therefrom doth hereby — Release acquit and discharge the said Benjamin Talbot his Heirs Executors and Administrators hath granted Bargained sold aliened Enfeoffed and Conveyed and by these presents doth grant Bargain Sell alien Enfess and Confer unto the said Benjamin Talbot his heirs and Assigns all that Tract or Parcell of Land lying and being in Frederick County on Maryland in the Province aforesaid taken out of a tract of Land called gaithor Blance beginning at the end of forty,
