(Senate Joint Resolution 19)

Senate Joint Resolution requesting a study of THAT INFORMATION CONCERNING the effects of mailing unemployment compensation checks to recipients. BE SUPPLIED THE TAXATION AND FISCAL MATTERS COMMITTEE OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, It was deemed advisable to institute a system of mailing unemployment compensation checks; and

WHEREAS, The purpose of such a procedure was to utilize personnel and time more efficiently; and

WHEREAS, This program was also to make it more convenient for recipients to receive their checks; and

WHEREAS, This program has been in operation long enough so that its effects may be measured and evaluated; now, therefore, be it

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Department of Employment Security be and is directed to ~~make a comprehensive study of the~~ SUPPLY INFORMATION CONCERNING check mailing procedure and to ~~determine specifically~~ THE DETERMINATION if any economies have been effectuated thereby and if there has been any rise in the number of claims for unemployment which is attributable thereto TO THE TAXATION AND FISCAL MATTERS COMMITTEE OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL; and be it further
